PreK4- Pre-K4 is off to a great start! In September and October, we are learning about our school, family, and friends. The students are exploring shapes, materials, and colors. We are also learning attributes by comparing various objects. During Science, we are exploring and learning to use science materials.

September: Hello from Speech and Language! This month we would like to take the opportunity to introduce you to our speech therapists that serve Shoemaker Elementary for this school year. She's been at Shoemaker as a speech therapist since 2021 and loves working with her students! While not at school, Mrs. Brooke enjoys reading a good book and traveling with her husband. She graduated from East Tennessee State this past May and spent this summer hanging out by the pool with her dogs and getting ready to work with Scott County Schools! SPOTLIGHT on the Classroom (cont.):

Below is a highlight of what's going on in third through sixth grade.

Third - Our third graders are off to a great start for Reading! They have read several exciting stories from our textbook already while working on various reading skills. Soon, we will be starting our first chapter book study. In English class, they have been working on writing complete sentences correctly, identifying the subject and predicate of a sentence, and correcting runon sentences. The students have been working on various spelling rules, syllables, and putting words in alphabetical order in our spelling class. Each week the students are writing a new paragraph for the "Newspaper in Education" program. We hope to see many published authors this year in the newspaper. In Math, we will be working on place value up to the hundred thousand place, rounding, and comparing numbers as well. We will then be moving to addition and subtraction that will go up to 4-digit numbers. In History, we will be learning about continents and some geographic features. We will also be learning about ancient China. In Science, we will study scientific investigation and living systems. Mrs. Gardner, Mrs. Johnson, Mrs. Price

Fourth In reading, we are reading in our reading book as well as a novel, <u>Stone Fox</u>! We are practicing all of our SOL's already! In class we are working on Unit 1 in English. To begin 4th grade math, we will be covering multiplication facts through 12. We will review/work on these through activities, online games, and group activities. We will also be reviewing place value and beginning computation of whole numbers. In fourth grade science, during the months of September and October, we will be studying weather and oceans! We will investigate how weather conditions and phenomena effect ecosystems and how they can be predicted. We will explore the ocean environment characteristics and the interactions of the organisms in the ocean. In Virginia Studies we will be covering VS2 Virginia's geography and native people. Mrs. Kegley, Mrs. Lawson, Ms. Rush

Fifth-We will begin our fifth grade year learning about context clues, character traits, story elements, and point of view in our reading classes. These skills will be covered as we read the novel, Shiloh. We will also be expanding our vocabulary with weekly vocabulary and spelling lists. We are looking forward to composing our first essay! Look for our budding authors in the Kingsport Times News each Friday. In grammar, we will be focusing on sentences. In Math, we will start off with our place value unit and rounding decimal numbers. In September, we will begin learning how to add, subtract, multiply, and divide with whole numbers and decimal numbers! October brings adding and subtracting fractions and mixed numbers, and soon we will incorporate word problems with fractions. In Science, we are studying basic science skills and continuing on with Ecosystems. During October, students will cover a unit on matter and begin studying plants. Vocabulary will be sent home to study for each unit. In history we will begin with continents and oceans, geographic regions of North America, and bodies of water and landforms. October's history classes will begin with early civilizations and explorers before continuing on to the creation of our United States. We will learn about the Native American Indians along with European explorers and the lands that they explored. Ms. Arnold,

Sixthe In Language Arts we are reviewing Grade 5 Grammar Skills. We are also working on an Independent Reading Project using "I Survived" books. We are also working on story elements and will begin reading the novel Hatchet by Gary Paulson. In math we will be working on ratio and learning how to convert between fractions, decimals, and percents. In history we have been working hard to learn the 50 states to begin this year! We are also learning important US cities and the regions that the states and cities belong to.
